# Teen and Ty games

Cut out the number cards, the word cards and the bingo boards. Although 12 doesn't sound like a 'teen' number, it has been included to reinforce its visual similarity with the teens and its difference from 20. The initial sorting activity will establish this.

## Sorting activity

Give the number cards to the pupil to sort under the correct teen or ty word card. Encourage them to say each number clearly. Discuss how 12 will be with the teens, as although we don't say 'teen', it has only one ten like the teen numbers.

## Listening activity 1

Put the number cards in a pile face down and give the pupil the teen and ty word cards. Take the top card from the pile and read the number without showing it. Ask the pupil to hold up the appropriate word card. If correct, they may keep the number card. If incorrect, return it to the pile.

## **Listening activity 2**

Spread out the number cards face up. Say one of the numbers for the pupil to find and place by the correct ty/teen word card.

## Speaking activity

Repeat listening activity 1, but this time with the pupil reading the number cards for you to identify.

#### Guess my number 1

Spread out the number cards face up. Write one of the numbers down on a piece of paper, then tell the pupil how many tens and units it has. They must pick and read out the card that has the number you've described. If the card matches the number you wrote, they can keep it. Once the pupil is confident, switch roles.

#### Guess my number 2

Put the number cards in a pile face down. One person picks the top card and says how many tens and units the number has. The other person must write the number on a piece of paper and then say it. If they do both correctly, they can keep the card. Switch roles after each turn.

#### Bingo (2 or 3 players)

Two players each take a board. Use either the two boards with all teen/all ty numbers (easier) or the two boards with mixed teens and tys (harder). Put the number cards in a pile face down. The caller (or one of the players) picks a card without showing it and says the number. The person with that number on their board may cover it with the number card. The first person to cover a row of four wins.

## Bingo (up to 5 players)

Each player chooses any board. The caller picks a card and reads the number without showing it. Anyone with the number on their board can cover it with a counter. The caller then shows the number card to help identify any incorrectly covered numbers. The first person to cover a row of four wins.
